FORUM IN 2024/25

Neighbourhood Plan 2025-2040

- Review of 2018 Plan began in 2022.
- Extensive public consultation: public meetings, opinion survey, statutory consultation on new draft, leaflet sent to every household. Publicised in press.
- Forum submitted Plan to Camden in July 2024.
- Camden sent Plan to independent examiner in November 2024.
- Forum responded to questions from examiner.
- Examiner determined no referendum will be needed.
- Examiner recommends Plan be 'made' by Camden

CONSTITUTION

Draft revised constitution drawn up as part of Forum's application for redesignation, which was approved in 2024

Aim was to modernise it and bring into line with Forum's current practice

Changes slightly broaden eligibility for membership

Language expanded to ensure the Forum is committed to inclusivity and non-discrimination, in line with Camden policies

Draft has been posted on Forum and Camden websites.



FINANCES

2016-2019 – Developing the Original Plan

- Supported by grants from Locality, topped up by PWRA

2020-2023 – Monitoring the Plan, preparing for renewal

- Recurring spend of up to £500 met from generous local support
- Air Quality Project (2021-22) appeal funding of £2,425.

2024-2025 - Plan Renewal

- Ssupported by grant from Locality (Plan healthcheck, Basic Conditions Statement and Graphic Design)
- Examiner's modifications further Locality grant may be needed.

2026-2028 - Next steps?

- Recurring spend of £500 to £800. Provision for future projects.






